Happy upcoming Thanksgiving! Please note that the next Friday email will be sent on December 2. Here are some items for you as we head into Thanksgiving week.

#### **School Choice Application (Important for Siblings)**

The applications for the Hamilton County School Choice period have been opened. The School Choice application period is from November 14 through January 31. For information on applying for School Choice seats and completing the application, please <u>click here</u>. Students who currently attend the STEM School do not have to re-apply through the School Choice application for next year.

IMPORTANT NOTE REGARDING SIBLINGS: If you have a child that does NOT currently attend STEM and you would like for them to do so next year, you will need to complete the School Choice application AND HCS Sibling Form. The HCS Sibling Form must be returned to our front office by *DECEMBER 9*. So, if you have a child that is in Grade 8 and you would like for them to attend next year, fill the HCS Sibling Form out as soon as possible and return it to our front office. In addition, make sure to complete the School Choice application by January 31. These are mandatory steps in order for a student to be given sibling preference to enroll at the STEM School in 2023-24.

#### Thanksgiving Week

STEM students (all grades 9-12) should attend all STEM School classes on Monday, Nov 21 and Tuesday, Nov 22. The STEM School will be closed on Wednesday, Nov 23 through Friday, Nov 25 for the Thanksgiving holiday break. Chattanooga State will be closed the entire week (no college classes) from Monday, Nov 21 through Friday, Nov 25.

## November 11, 2022 - STEM School Info 11/11

Parents/Guardians.

Happy Veterans' Day! Here are some items of note for you upcoming.

#### **Quarter 2 PBLs**

As we hit the halfway mark of quarter two, here are grade level PBLs (project-based learning units) that are taking place across the school.

Grade 9 students are working collaboratively to design, build, and code VEX robots in order to introduce and expand students' knowledge of the essential concepts of robotics. For students with previous robotics experience, these students are working in teams building and coding VEX EDR robots. For students with no robotics experience, these students are working in teams building and coding VEX IQ robots. Teams in both groups will ultimately participate in a cumulative robotics competition in EDR or IQ, respectively, on Friday, Dec 9. Students are also creating a Robotics Video to act as an additional resource to consumers, including robot performance and troubleshooting tips.

Grade 10 students have been meeting with personnel from the Creative Discovery Museum (CDM) to develop ideas for elementary STEM lesson plans. Groups are choosing elementary math or science standard(s) and creating a lesson plan that details a STEM lesson for the standard(s) used. CDM personnel are assessing the lessons for quality. Student teams meeting the standard set by CDM will have the opportunity to implement the lessons with grade 4 or 5 students at the end of the fall semester.

Grade 11 students are working on varied STEM projects with business and community partners throughout Chattanooga. Each grade 11 team chooses one project from the following for the quarter. The projects this quarter include:

- --Creative Discovery Museum: Coding Machine for Kids Students are creating a Coding Machine for Kids for family night programs conducted by the Creative Discovery Museum.
- --EPB: Holiday Window Build Students are working with EPB to build the EPB Holiday Windows and use STEM School designs.
- --Fillauer: Heat Sensor Students are designing and fabricating a prototype design for a prosthetic demo socket that uses electronics and mechanical actuators to open and close the prosthetic.
- --Lincoln-Electric: Weld Shop Design Students are redesigning the Lincoln-Electric existing weld shop to make it safer to navigate, weld, and store materials. STEM students are using 2D and 3D design software to create an efficient workspace.
- --Reflection Riding Arboretum: Informational Signage Students are creating informational signage for the plant nursery at the Arboretum.

--Siskin Kids: Adaptable Toys – Students are creating adaptable toys for children with special needs.

--STEM School: Math Hallway Makeover – Students are designing and building out an inspiring STEM Math Hallway to motivate and excite students about the power and possibilities of math.

Grade 12 students are working to finish their startup business plans and pitch for the upcoming Inventanooga entrepreneurship annual competition. Students use design thinking to identify and network with a target audience, analyze their expressed needs, invent a solution, and pitch their invention. After identifying their real-world problem, students then seek expert knowledge to help ideate, invent, and test a solution with their prospective customers. Students build a business plan to produce their product, and present their inventions and formal business plan at the Inventanooga pitch competition in December. We are incredibly excited with the inventions and solutions being designed by our seniors!

November is here! Here are some items of note as we begin the month.

#### Student Led Conferences – Nov 7 and 10

At the STEM School we do not have traditional Parent Teacher Conferences where the parent comes in and a teacher talks about all the things your child is doing. Instead, our conferences are focused on the student leading a conference with parents and a faculty member. The reason for doing so is because it is vitally important for the student to take ownership in his/her progress, be able to communicate what he/she has learned, and be able to communicate at what level of understanding and mastery he/she is performing. We will have Student Led Conferences during the evenings of Monday, November 7 and Thursday, November 10. All parents and students are expected to participate.
