Happy House Celebration Day! It's been a great spirit week at STEM and we are excited as the week culminates with a House Competition and STEM Jam this evening. Here are some items of note going forward.

STEM Jam Tonight – Oct 28

STEM Jam is STEM's version of hanging out and getting together for STEM students. Some schools host a school dance, we host STEM Jam! It is an opportunity for STEM students to play some games, eat some food, and connect outside of the school day. This event happens each fall, so don't miss out!

This year's STEM Jam will also include a Haunted Hallway. The Haunted Hallway is the STEM School adaptation of a haunted house. It is designed and hosted by STEM students, featuring a few of your teachers sprinkled in... enter at your own risk. Mwahahaha.

The STEM Jam is also used to raise funds for our Robotics Teamand House Committee. The cost for admission is \$10 per student. Tickets can still be purchased at the door for students who have not yet purchased tickets. The STEM Jam will take place from 5:30pm to 8pm. Only STEM students are allowed to attend.

IMPORTANT: The school day dismisses at 4:30pm for grade 9 and 10 students. Underclassmen students who decide to stay for the STEM Jam should not be wandering around the Chattanooga State campus. There will be activities they can participate in outside with the Heads of House or they may wait in the Commons at STEM until the STEM Jam begins. They should not be in the college building areas.

What will STEM Jam feature? Music, costume contest(with prize), pizza, snacks, drinks, Super Smash Brothers competition(\$5 competition entry fee), haunted hallway, and more!

Move2Stand – Nov 1 (Grade 9)

Next week, students in grade 9 will participate in an important culture building opportunity called Move2Stand. Move2Stand is an interactive training program of STARS (Students Taking A Right Stand) that challenges students to examine their attitudes toward bullying. This one-day youth summit creates empathy and helps young leaders understand how bullying impacts school climate and communities. Since we have students that come from all over the county, this also provides a unique opportunity for freshmen to learn about each other and delve more into the grade 9 diversity focus for collaboration. Student Led Conferences – Nov 7 and 10

At the STEM School we do not have traditional Parent Teacher Conferences where the parent comes in and a teacher talks about all the things your child is doing. Instead, our conferences are focused on the student leading a conference with parents and a faculty member. The reason for doing so is because it is vitally important for the student to take ownership in his/her progress, be able to communicate what he/she has learned, and be able to communicate at what level of understanding and mastery he/she is performing. We will have Student Led Conferences during the evenings of Monday, November 7 and Thursday, November 10. All parents and students are expected to participate.

To accommodate parents and students to make the conference as convenient as possible for you, all conferences will be held virtually through Zoom. Each parent and student have been sent an email from their House faculty advisor inviting the parent to the SLC. Parents will have the opportunity to email with the House faculty advisor to set up a time between 6pm and 8pm for the conference. The House faculty advisor will share a Zoom link with the parent and student for the meeting.

Dress Code and Student Handbook

As is the case each year, we have a lot of costumes and participation in spirit week dress up days.

We certainly enjoy this experience with our students and staff. When we return next week though,

we want to remind everyone that all students are to be inSTEM Dress Code developed and created

by the student senate. The senate meets every month with Dr. Donen to address changes, edits,

ideas for improved school culture. If any changes to school handbook items are made (including

dress code), they are updated immediately after a meeting and communicated in STEM General to

students and staff. Allstudent handbook items (intervention tables, dress code, handbook) can

also be found on our school website (which always has the most up-to-date information for the

handbook).

School Donations – Can We Accept Donations?

The STEM Parent Leadership Team and STEM administration have been working with Hamilton

County Schools central office on donation policies for the county. STEM parents have approached

the STEM PLT asking if they can donate money for items like Staff Appreciation meals. The HCS

central office has made it clear that we cannot directly ask for monetary donations to the school

from parents. So, we will not be asking parents for monetary donations. However, please note that

the HCS central office also has stated that anyone can make a monetary donation. So, the short

version is this... if an individual, business, organization chooses to contact our front office and give

a monetary donation for a particular purpose, we can accept the donation and will provide the

donating party with a receipt. For example, we recently received a check for \$100 from a local

organization for STEM activities.
